### 5<sup>th</sup>Sunday of Lent [Year B] 17<sup>th</sup> March 2024

My dear Brothers and Sisters,

"Now the hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified", Jesus tells Andrew and Philip in this Sunday's Gospel reading from St John [12:20-30]. Our readings this Sunday carry us towards the great Easter Feast in which we remember Jesus's self-offering and suffering on the Cross for our redemption. Pope Benedict XVI told us that "this is the will of God, to give eternal life to us who have lost it". 
