## 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of Lent [Year B] 25<sup>th</sup> February 2024

My dear Brothers and Sisters,

"This is my Son, the Beloved. Listen to him," God the Father tells us in this Sunday's Gospel reading from St Mark [9:2-10]. Pope Benedict XVI urged us, during Lent especially, "to listen to Christ, like Mary. To listen to him in his Word, contained in sacred scripture. To listen to him in the events of our lives...Finally, to listen to him in our brothers and sisters, especially in the lowly and the poor, for whom Jesus himself demands our concrete love". In our actions of prayer and penance and fasting and almsgiving we should listen to the voice of Jesus and allow Him to guide us on our way forward to the great celebration of the Resurrection at Easter.

We have three adults being confirmed at the Easter Vigil this year and at least three children making their First Eucharist on Easter Sunday at the 10.30am Parish Mass. In addition, some 40 children are preparing for the Sacrament of Confirmation on Saturday 16 March. Please keep all these people in your prayers as they take these important steps in their journey of faith in Jesus Christ.

This week the parish received the invoice for the new insurance arrangements for our church and presbytery following the closure of Catholic Insurances. Our bill for insuring our beloved parish church and the presbytery and covering all the necessary liabilities has now increased by 25% to \$16000. Fortunately, our very careful protection of our resources has enabled us to make this payment immediately. However, we can expect further increases next year and this highlights the need for our parishioners to take the issue of their contributions to the parish very seriously. If contributions do not increase, then we will soon use up all our savings in paying such accounts as these. St Paul tells us in this Sunday's reading from Romans [8:31-34] "With God on our side who can be against us". Let us take heart from those

words and move confidently forward through this beautiful Season of Lent/Ouaresima.
