3rd Sunday of Lent [Year B] 3rd March 2024

My dear Brothers and Sisters,

"God's foolishness is wiser than human wisdom, and God's weakness is stronger than human strength", St Paul tells us in this week's reading from 1 Corinthians [1:22-25]. As we journey through this serene season of Lent, doing our best to offer up works of prayer and penance and fasting and almsgiving, let us meditate on God's wisdom and his strength. As so many parishioners face difficult situations and difficult decisions about health and home and family let us have the good sense and humility to turn to our God who loves us and ask Him for His help and His healing.

This week the Dominican Sisters of the Most Holy Rosary have announced the team of three Sisters who are to come and establish a convent here in our midst in St Raphael's Parish. Their leader will be Sister Jessica who speaks fluent Italian. All are qualified teachers and will bring great energy and skills and prayerfulness to their work among us. They will come to join us as soon as their visas have been granted. The St Raphael's presbytery will, from Easter, be undergoing a complete clean and repainting and modification inside to prepare it for occupation by the Dominican Sisters when they arrive. Arrangements are in hand to house Fr Aurelio Fragapane close by St Raphel's Parish Church. An announcement can be expected very soon on a new parish secretary for our partner parishes, working three days each week at Reservoir and one day at West Preston. The parish office for St Raphael's will continue to be in the front portion of the presbytery.

I am moving rapidly towards my retirement, with my last Mass officially being Easter Sunday 31 March. Between now and then I have a great deal to do to move my possessions out of the presbytery and place my affairs in order. However, I am doing as much visiting of the sick and homebound parishioners as I can whilst I am still here with you. If you would like a visit from me in the next four weeks, please ring to let me know.

Let us all work to proclaim the good news of Jesus, the "Christ who is the power and wisdom of God" [1 Corinthians !:22-25].
